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The network aims to

- keep members informed of changes to regulations, legislation and policy.
- Facilitate a community of shared support and shared experience
- share resources and good practice
- facilitate discussion on current practice
- make available information of conferences, seminars and other training opportunities.
- create an evidence-base for advocacy and campaigning

Background

The Refugee Health Network was conceived following workshops held by Medact during the period 1999 - 2001. In each case the evaluations recorded that the most important aspect of the day had been the ability to meet and share information with fellow health workers.

The Refugee Health Network (RHN) was developed to enable this process to continue. The network is open to anyone who works with refugees and asylum seekers.

Who we are

The network currently has 267 members the vast majority of whom are health workers working directly with asylum seekers and refugees. Other members include academics, students and community workers.

What we do

Members of the network aim to share information and resources. Many of our members have years of professional experience and are available to share this expertise with others. Several successful partnerships and projects have been developed across the network.

Above all the network is a cooperative effort. We believe that we all have something to share and something to learn.

Please note

- Messages sent to the list will be distributed to **all** members.
- Messages must be approved by moderator simply to ensure that private, commercial and abusive messages are not posted. There is **no** censorship of relevant messages
